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
How We Conducted the Survey

We surveyed 289 adults who are involved in Tennessee policy making, including registered lobbyists, consultants, elected and appointed officials from the executive and legislative branches, government staffers, and organization leaders. The survey was conducted online from August 16-September 16, 2022.



WHERE INSIDERS GET THEIR NEWS

Tennessee policy insiders report reading The Tennessee Journal most often (82%), followed by The Tennessean (75%). Relative newcomer Tennessee Lookout is read regularly or often by 41% of respondents.






HOW INSIDERS RATE KEY TENNESSEE ORGANIZATIONS


Insiders say that they most often <u>see or hear about</u> The Beacon Center and the Tennessee Chamber of Commerce & Industry.
